Share information about the **Centers for Disease Control (CDC) National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (NBCCEDP)** for free cervical cancer screenings, diagnostic testing, and cancer treatment for women who have no health insurance and meet program eligibility requirements.

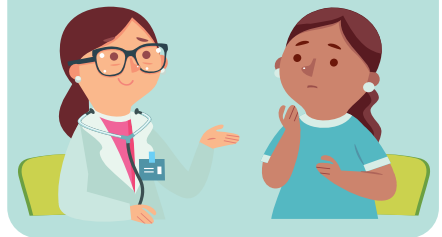
Encourage women in your community to get screened for **cervical cancer** regularly

Encourage women who have had an **abnormal HPV/Pap test** to go **back to the doctor** for a follow-up appointment



Encourage moms, dads, and legal guardians to talk to their doctor about their children (boys and girls aged **9 - 18**) getting the **HPV** vaccination. If they do not have health insurance, **Vaccines for Children (VFC)** provides **free HPV vaccine** for children and adolescents **9 - 18** years of age
